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Description: The CIRRIE Database of International Rehabilitation Research currently contains almost 90,000 citations of international rehabilitation research published between 1990 and the present. The CIRRIE Database collects citations from all areas of rehabilitation and compiles them into one central source. In addition to indexing from mainstream journals and internet sites, CIRRIE also includes citations to resources not readily available to U.S. researchers. Over 5000 journals are represented in the Database and abstracts are available for most citations. A list of journals is now available. There are almost 90,000 citations currently indexed with citations added monthly. The database includes citations from 1990 to the present. It was created to facilitate the sharing of information and expertise in rehabilitation and disability research between the U.S. and other countries.
