Launched as a joint collaboration between the National Institute on Aging (NIH) and the Alzheimer's Association, IADRP enables users the ability to assess the portfolios of major organizations (currently 30) for areas of overlap as well as areas of opportunities in which to collaborate and coordinate in a collective effort to advance AD research.
