Magnification allows for spatial resolution of up to 50 lp/mm. The 20 ?m nominal focal spot and up to 5X additional geometric magnification provide ultra high-contrast and high spatial resolution images. If a larger field of view is required, the MX-20 can be used with a CR plate and small, upright CR reader to obtain a field of view up to 10â€? x 12â€?.
